Lesson Aim/Objective(s):

By the end of this lesson, the students will be able explain the dangers of distractions, such as phones or electronic devices etc. while walking or riding a bicycle.

Material(s):

- 1. Sentence strips vocabulary (stop, no, look, yes, walk, phone)
- 2. Story Board part 5
- 3. Video #5

Instructional Delivery

Motivation:

Students all stand up and "read a book" while slowly walking around the room for a brief time. Then, lead a discussion about the experience. What happened? Did you run into anything or anyone? Why is this dangerous?

Instruction/Procedure(s):

- 1. Complete Motivation game (BALL TOSS)
- 2. State /review the safety goals of STOP, LOOK left, LOOK right, then LOOK left again.
- 3. Share the Lesson Objective for this unit (Distracted walking or bike riding).
- 4. Show Video.
- 5. Use the guiding questions listed below for class discussion
 - a. Why did Harley stop walking? What did Hobbit want Harley to do and why did Harley not want to do it?
 - b. What did Mom have to say about texting when walking or riding a bike?
- 6. Review the discussion by adding to the storyboard. (Model drawing the characters acting out the story.

Assessment/Evaluation Activity

Have students share why it is important to pay attention when riding a bike or walking.

Follow Up

Centers:

- Language Arts: sight words/rebus sentences
 Sequencing cards
- 2. Blocks: Cars/Pedestrians practice moving on floor (create a map with painter's tape.)
- 3. **Fine Motor**: Create a "no phone" sign (a phone with an "X" over it).
- 4. **Dramatic Play**: Add used/broken phones to the center for students to model correctly walking with the phones in their pocket or by their sides.
 - Flannel board Characters for re-enacting the video story. (Harley, Hobbit, sidewalk, phone, bike, helmet.

Differentiation Ideas

- 1. Students use rebus cards to retell the video story.
- 2. Brainstorm a list of words that describe: PAYING ATTENTION
- 3. Color sheets from video shots.
