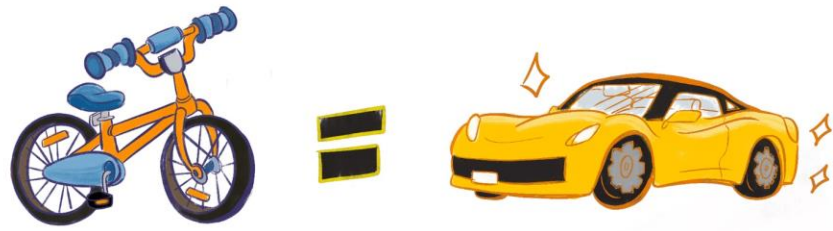
The helmet

Hobbit began to imagine what type of car his bike would be.






"What a SWEET ride!"



Now Hobbit and Harley are ready to head off to the park!






On their way, they

Hobbit!



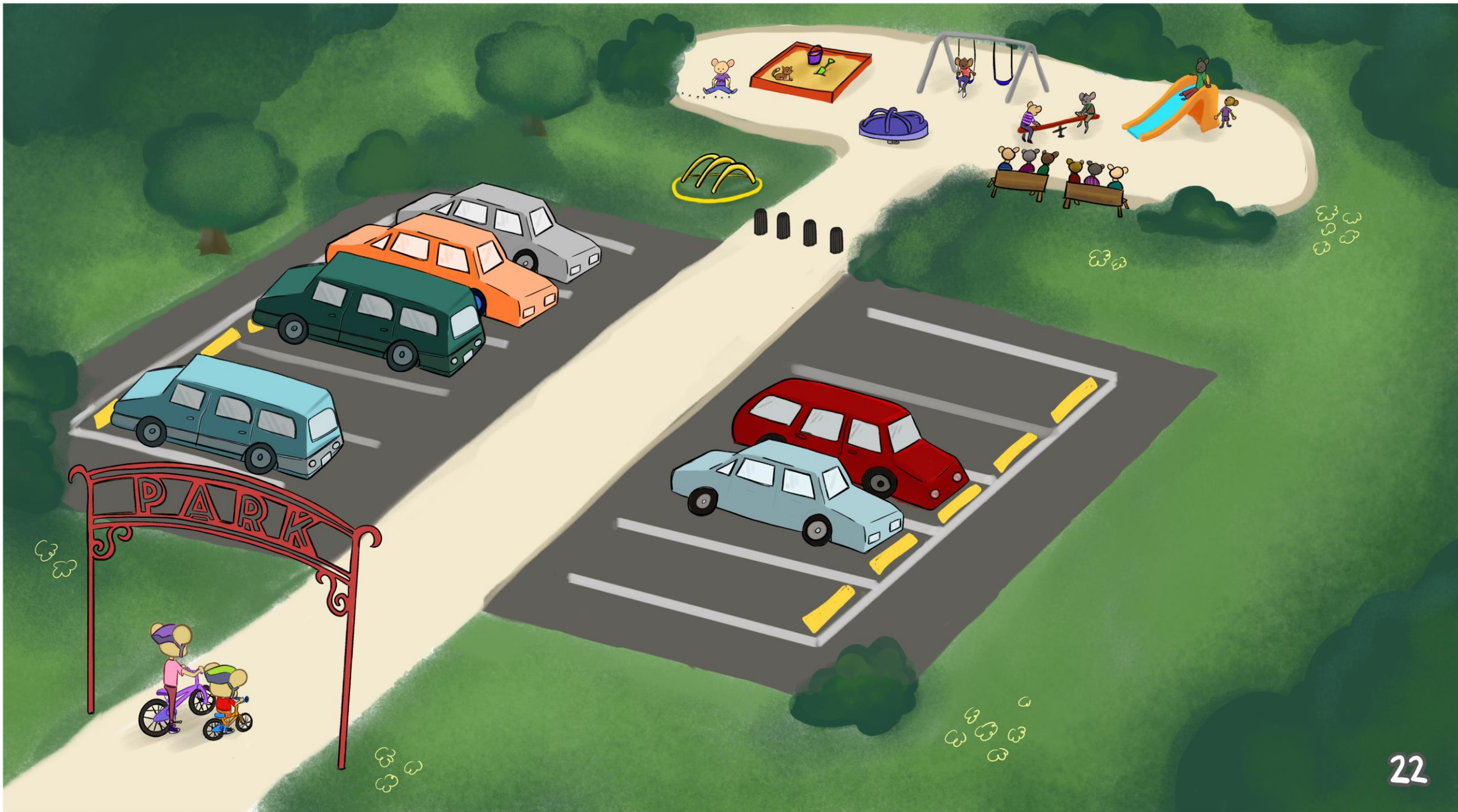


“We made it!”

“Just because we can see a car doesn’t mean they can see us.”

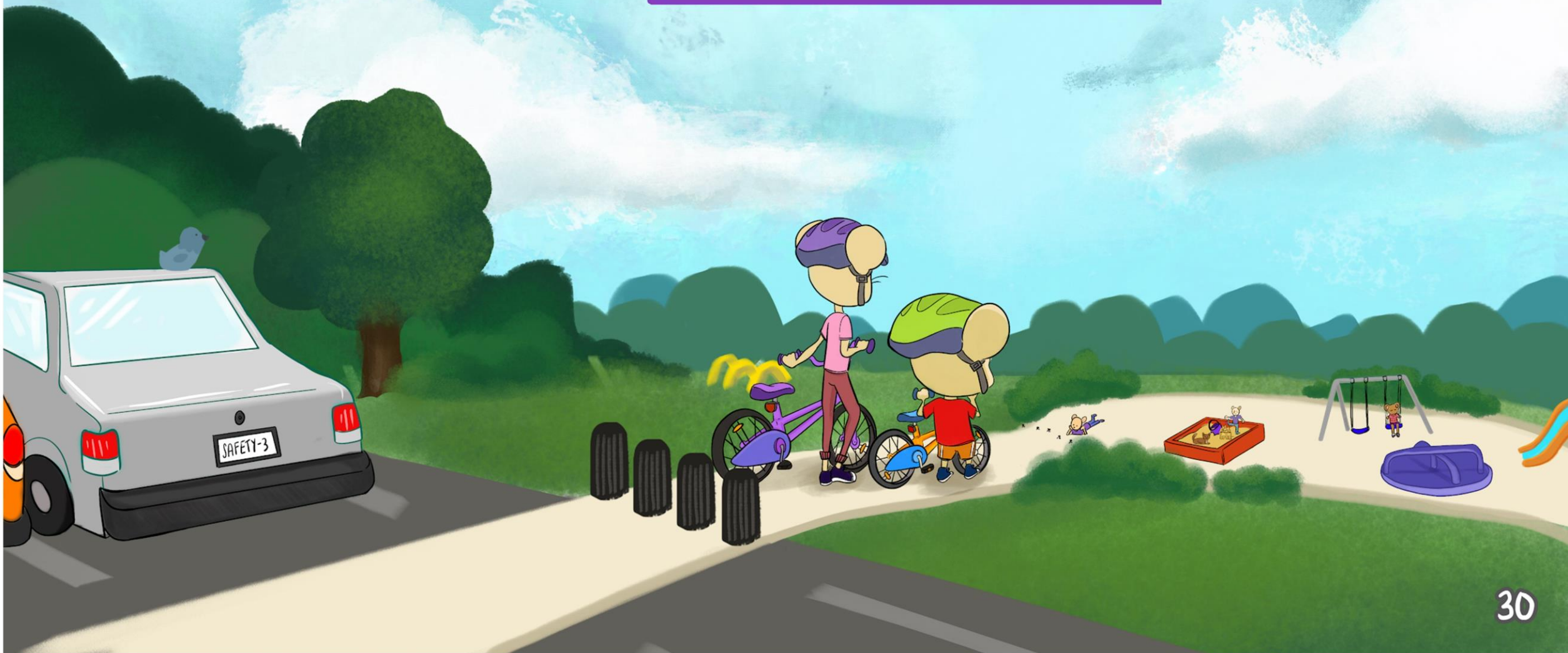




“We need to keep an eye out for moving cars and make sure they can see us.”

“We made it!” shouted Hobbit.





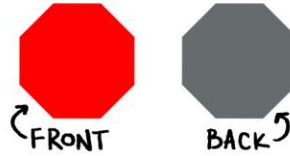
Thanks to the safety rules, Harley and Hobbit biked safely to the park and can play!





# LET'S LEARN!

1. Before getting on your bike, make sure your shoelaces are \_\_\_\_\_?
2. The straps on your helmet should make a letter around your ears.  
What is the name of the letter?
3. How many fingers can you fit between your chin and the helmet straps?
4. Before crossing a street you always look \_\_\_\_, then \_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_ again.  
(Hint: Direction words)
5. How many stop signs can you find in the book?  
(Hint: They are shaped like an octagon!)
6. When crossing a street and you see a stopped car in the intersection,  
what should you do? (Hint: There are 3 steps.)
7. To be safe, what should you look for when walking through a parking lot?



1. Tied! 2. Your straps should make a "V". 3. One to Two fingers. 4. Look LEFT, RIGHT, and LEFT again. 5. There are three stop signs : 6. You should always make eye contact with the driver, get their attention and wait until they tell you to go, and always look LEFT, RIGHT, and LEFT again before crossing. : 7. You need to check for cars that are moving or backing up.
